A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

Easter is the day we celebrate the greatest event in the world's history and it is a day which should be marked with celebration, with joy and jubilant singing. Yet, as I write this, the world seems to be in a state of instability and chaos and, come Easter Sunday, still will be. The resurrection of Jesus has led to the salvation of countless souls, but wars and rumours of wars persist. Despite this, I believe it is possible to know and experience real joy. By joy, I don't mean mere happiness. Real joy doesn't have much to do with our circumstances. Those who seemingly have everything going for them experience deep depression. People struggling through a deeply traumatic time have described experiencing something like a deep and inexplicable joy. So, joy isn't entirely bound up with our circumstances. It's a gift, and it centres on an experience of God's presence, whatever might be happening around us.

The events of Holy Week and Easter describe God entering into our fallen world and taking on sin and all its appalling consequences – and emerging victorious. Indestructibly, unquestioningly, unfailingly, the ultimate fact in our world is that God is in control. The Lamb is upon the throne and has more things in hand than we ever realise. Darkness and sin cannot overcome the light of Christ, and this is what we celebrate at Easter. This is the source of all true joy – that whatever sin has destroyed, God can, and will mend, and that those who choose Him are forever held in His love. The resurrection was the beginning of the end of the old order of things which, as scripture tells is, is passing away. The resurrection is also the primary event which marks the beginning of the encroaching of God's kingdom into our world, an encroachment which will one day see the realisation of the wonderful vision of the city of God in Revelation 22. In the meantime, we live with the certain knowledge of God's presence, and of His spirit dwelling within is. Because He lives, we also will live.

The 'Real' Christ

Long before Professor Indiana Jones burst on our cinema screens with "Raiders Of The Lost Ark", determined to keep that holy, gold-coated chest (holding the 10 Commandments) out of Nazi hands, there had always been worldwide interest in the actual whereabouts of the Ark of the Covenant.

Likewise, Dan Brown sold millions of books about the Holy Grail, the wine cup that Jesus actually used at the Last Supper. This is another subject which has intrigued people for centuries. Does this mysterious cup have a special power if ever we locate it?

And let's not forget the Shroud of Turin, in which it is claimed Jesus's body was wrapped at His burial, and His body somehow miraculously imprinted on the cloth. Other Churches claim to have wooden splinters from Christ's cross at Calvary, while the Knights Templar long ago claimed to have had another chest, supposedly containing a diary written by Jesus Himself.

So what? Have any of these ancient, religious artefacts produced an avalanche of revival throughout the Christian Church? No! Never! But a personal faith by men and women in the REAL, Living Christ in every generation, continues wonderfully to change people's lives. Inviting the Risen Jesus into our lives is a transforming experience. As St Paul powerfully testified, "If anyone is in Christ, he/she is a new creation. The old life is gone, the new life emerges!" (2 Cor 5 v17)

Shortly after the first mobile phones appeared in the 1970's, a woman's husband had a heart attack on a train journey somewhere in England. In panic, she looked up the train carriage and spotted a man talking on his mobile phone. She quickly walked up, and anxiously asked if she could use his phone to dial 999 for an ambulance. We would like to remind our drivers to be mindful of this space to allow all who want to and need to park on church grounds to be able to.


If there appears to be no more parking available or you are able to walk, there are spaces on the opposite side of the Lidl car park (close to the fields) that we can use.

We have had a chat with the manager of the store and he is happy for spaces that are away from the main shop to be used. There are no cameras or security systems; parking is completely free and there are no time restrictions.

The Leadership Team's main concern is that on days that the car park is very full emergency vehicles may not be able to access the site safely.

Please make sure that you are not parked in the fire assembly area (marked on the fence near the pedestrian front gate) opposite the church front door facing Lidl or covering any exit doors - see plan below. Some people are still parking in this area.

The Methodist Church has launched a new website - <u>methodist.org.uk</u>. It has a completely different layout to the old one and contains a lot more resources and information. Have a look and explore.

Extending a Warm Welcome to Communities

Over the winter, the cost of living crisis continued to bite into stretched household budgets and Methodist Churches across the Connexion were on hand to provide a warm, welcoming space for their communities. Warm Welcome, the new name for the Warm Spaces initiative, emphasised the need to tackle isolation, as well as the cold, by building connections and community.

Over 280 Methodist Churches were registered with the Warm Welcome website (<u>warmwelcome.uk</u>) for the winter. Many more simply opened their doors and events to those who were cold and in need of company.

The Methodist Church was second only to the Church of England in providing the most Warm Welcome spaces in the UK. However, measuring the scheme's impact is about far more than the numbers says Andrea Campanale, Mission Projects Officer, who takes care of the Warm Welcome initiative for the Methodist Church. "It's about local churches making a difference in their communities. Although kick-started by the cost of living crisis and the shock rise in energy prices last winter, research showed that the value of Warm Welcome spaces was in combatting loneliness and isolation.

"Neighbours who have lived close to each other for years have got to know each other at a Warm Welcome space and have grown into relationships that now provide support and company"

Many of the Warm Welcome spaces are becoming community hubs. Open all year round, one idea being considered is how Warm Welcome could provide essential respite from the heat as summer temperatures increase to dangerous levels.

The Warm Welcome Space at St Andrew's Methodist Church, Sheringham is open each Tuesday between 10am and 3pm to welcome friends from the local community. Tea, coffee, hot chocolate are offered all day and at lunchtime there is soup and a roll.

Barbara George is a church steward and one of the volunteers for the Warm

Welcome at St Andrew's Methodist. "We have a table of ladies whose friendship has grown and they enjoy playing a game of cards together or a game of bingo. Two gentlemen enjoyed playing backgammon and chess together. It became obvious that as well as people having a warm safe space to meet, the need to challenge social isolation was especially important."

Those who used the space were keen to share how it made a difference to their lives. "I've enjoyed sitting and chatting; having people to listen; lovely soup and unlimited tea and coffee," said one. Another commented, "Our flat suffers from being in a very cold building. The social interaction has been equally beneficial and we have had lots of fun and laughter with the obvious health benefits that brings."
