A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

It's one of those years where it's a good summer if you're a sports fan, but potentially rather annoying if you're not. After wall to wall coverage of the European Football Championships (England's humiliation somewhat softened by the 12 years of living in Wales and so able to feel some justification in sharing their success!), our screens will soon be full of Olympic and Paralympic coverage. There will be successes and disappointment. Various dreams stand on the verge of fulfilment. For some, just reaching the games is the fulfilment of a lifetime's ambition, for others, only gold will do. Whatever the dream, it has taken months, if not years of dedicated hard work and sacrifice to get to this point. Careful attention is paid to every detail; diet, sleep, stretching, strength, technique, equipment will all have been refined to get in the best shape. It is, however, not uncommon to hear coaches and athletes talk about one thing that matters more than any of these – desire, determination, motivation, hunger. Apparently it is this that enables the endless early morning starts, the practice through dark winter months and the competitive edge to squeeze out that last bit of effort when your body is screaming stop.

And it seems it was this that impressed the apostle Paul about athletes in his day. Their desire to win enabled them to do what it takes to achieve their goal, win the prize. This was something that Paul could relate to – doing what it takes in order to share the Good news of God's love with all, and in so doing, sharing in the blessings of this love that had embraced him (1 Cor 9: 20-27).

In introducing his theme for the year – holiness – the new President of Conference, Roger Walton, suggested that some have found it more helpful to understand holiness as our spiritual fitness. It is how we train ourselves to become more fully those who bear God's image and are being transformed into his likeness. Those practices of prayer, reading scripture, worship, giving (not just of our money, but our time and abilities), meeting together, fasting, simplicity and celebration are some of the ways in which Jesus' disciples have traditionally trained themselves to follow in Jesus' way. Ways which help to open them up to God's renewing, transforming and redeeming love.

As we watch the athletes compete this summer, let it be a prompt to reflect on our own spiritual fitness. Do we desire to know God's love more and to continue being transforming in his likeness? Like Paul, are we prepared to do what it takes? What one change could you make as you continue to run this race of faith?

Methodist Church to Review its Understanding of Marriage and Relationships

A task group established to consider whether the Methodist Church's understanding of marriage and relationships should be revisited has reported back to this year's Methodist Conference.

Following a decision at the Conference in 2014, people from across the Methodist Connexion have been considering marriage and relationships as part of a process overseen by the task group. The discussions show that there is a broad range of opinions held by Methodists on these matters.

The Church is to reconsider how its understanding of marriage should be expressed. This does not necessarily mean that there will be a change of definition, but that the Church wishes to re-examine the definition through a period of theological and scriptural reflection.

The task group prepared guidance and other resources to help members of the Methodist Church in their discussions on marriage and relationships.

The task group was established at the Methodist Conference in 2014 to consider whether or not the Methodist Church should revisit its definition of marriage and its understanding of family life, marriage and the single person. Its report, received by the Methodist Conference earlier today, 5 July 2016, is the result of two years consideration by the task group, along with reflection and conversation within the Methodist Church. So far, at least 8,000 members have taken the opportunity to participate in conversations across the Methodist Church, where a wide range of views were expressed.

The Church's definition of marriage was one of those subjects discussed. The task group considered the existing 1992 "Statement on Christian Understanding of Family Life, The Single Person and Marriage". In the Statement the Methodist Church reiterates its view that marriage is "the lifelong union of one man and one woman". However, whilst many Methodists support this definition as it stands, there is a range of reasons to revisit it. For example, some people feel the Church's definition should be extended to include the marriage of same sex couples. Some people feel that the definition only describes the status of marriage, not its purpose and responsibilities and revisiting the definition is important part of the process even if it remains unchanged. The Conference directed that a new

Statement on marriage and relationships should now be prepared and that, as part of that process, the definition of marriage should be revisited.

The Methodist Children's Youth and Assembly, 3Generate, also considered marriage and relationships at the request of the young people themselves. 3Generate recommended that youth workers and ministers should be trained to create safe spaces to talk about all interpretations of relationships to encourage discussions about same sex marriage.

The Revd Graham Carter, Chair of the Marriage and Relationships Task Group commented; "It is essential to take time over this issue because the process of finding a way forward is as important as reaching a decision. Enabling people in the church to talk openly about their differing convictions and value their common commitment to Jesus Christ is key to what it means to be a Christian community.

"The decision of the Conference to establish a working party on the matters of marriage and relationships is an important step which comes from a widespread conversation in which people have listened, respected each other's position and engaged in deep reflection together. The conversations will continue and we will go on responding to the challenges of interpreting God's love for today's society.

Thank God for the annual miracle of seedtime and harvest, His gracious provision for us all.



News from the Methodist Church

Following on from the EU Referendum

The Revd Steve Wild and Jill Barber, the President and Vice-President of the Methodist Conference, have released this statement:

“The people have spoken through the democratic process. We recognise that the result will cause pain to some people who voted with passion and integrity and that now is the time to move forward together with goodwill. The structures have changed but our hopes for a fair, just and equal society continue. We must now gather the political will to tackle poverty, climate change and the refugee crisis.

“This referendum has shown both the best and the worst of our democracy. It is to be celebrated that major constitutional change has happened peacefully and transparently; something that is all too rare in the world even today. We are saddened that the referendum debate has at times promoted feelings of fear and even hatred and racism. We do not believe that most people, however they voted in the referendum, wanted this. It certainly does not represent the kind of country that Britain wants to be. We must be careful now that these narratives do not shape the way that we do politics in the future.

“As the future of our role in the EU is negotiated, we cannot cut ourselves off from Europe. We pray for our brothers and sisters in Europe, and particular in our sister Churches, and assure them that our love and commitment towards them is undiminished.”

The Joint Public Issues Team offered this prayer:

God of every nation and people, at this historic moment we pray for all who are affected by the decision that we have made.

Whatever differences this has revealed within our own society, may they not eclipse what we have in common.

Where the narratives of political debate have caused harm and division, help us to reclaim the true values of our shared humanity.

Where exaggeration and distortion have generated suspicion and fear, may truth and honesty restore hope and goodness.

We pray for all the nations of Europe that you will help us to find ways of living and working together to pursue the mercy and justice that you require.

We recommit ourselves – together – to the values of your eternal kingdom, and pray that along with all people we might help your world become more as you intended. Amen.


Roger Walton - President of the Conference 2016/2017

Growing up in Pudsey, West Yorkshire, Roger Walton started attending a Methodist Sunday School at the age of seven. He became a Christian at 16, becoming a local preacher at 18 and offering for ministry whilst at university.

Married to Marion and with two children and three grandchildren, Roger has served in circuits in the West

Midlands, Liverpool and St Albans. For ten years he was the Director of the Open Learning Centre, followed by eleven years of the Wesley Study Centre. He is currently Chair of the West Yorkshire District.

“Becoming President of the Conference is a wonderful gift and I am deeply honoured,” said Roger. “I owe so much to the Methodist people and have learned the way of Jesus in this Church. I hope to encourage us to continue to be a learning, loving and outward-looking community for transformation of the world.”



Rachel Lampard - Vice-President of the Conference 2016/2017

Rachel Lampard is the daughter of a Methodist minister and her early memories are of sitting at the manse kitchen table, discussing religion and politics. These twin passions have continued throughout her life. Growing up in London in the 1980s, she was deeply affected by increasing homelessness. On leaving university she found work with housing charities, including Catholic Housing Aid Society leading their policy and campaign work.

Rachel began working for the Methodist Church in 2000 and in 2008 became Team Leader of Joint Public Issues Team, a collaboration of four denominations, including the Methodist Church, campaigning and speaking out on issues of poverty, climate change and peace.

Rachel says, “Methodists care about God’s world. I’m excited by how Methodists, inspired by God, get stuck in and have such a passion for justice.”

In 2006 Rachel was appointed as a Commissioner with the Gambling Commission, responsible for regulating the gambling industry. She focused particularly on protecting children and vulnerable people. She was awarded an MBE for her efforts in this year’s Queen’s Birthday Honours List.

Rachel is married to Steve and they have three children.
