

A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

Psalm 22

Psalm 22 was given to the ancient Israelites as a prayer to be used when they felt cut off and alienated from God. God may be ever-present, but our feelings and circumstances fluctuate and sometimes we feel as if God has abandoned us. However, at one point in scripture, we hear the words of this psalm being used to describe a situation in which the speaker was very literally cut off from God. The speaker is Jesus. Jesus experienced complete separation from God in order to save us from that same fate. Jesus endured the very worst thing any human being could face, being cut off from God – the one fate from which there is no return, so that we can enjoy eternal life.

Was Psalm 22 then, pointing towards Jesus? Undoubtedly, as much of the Old Testament does. Scripture often works on different levels though. This psalm, despite its bleak tone, is an encouragement to those in horrendous circumstances that God is still on the throne and does not change. He is still the God of deliverance and hope, even (perhaps especially) to those who are reviled and ridiculed by everyone else. Even those who feel they are mere 'worms'. It is a prayer we can use when awful things happen and God seems to do nothing. It reassures us that we can bring our pain and our anguished questions to God and know that He hears those cries, even if He seems to do nothing. I say 'seems' because God is unalterably and always a God of healing and restoration, whether that happens within or outside of time. The main thing to remember is that those who keep their connection to God open, even if all they can do at times is to cry out in pain, are better able to discern where God is in a given situation and will, one day, be in a position to say 'proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn because He has acted.' Amen to that.

Struggling With Unwon Victories

Life is a struggle, even more so it seems at present.

The cost of living is restricting most people. Food prices have soared, and some parents go without meals so their children can eat. Crippling rent and mortgage rises have meant that many young adults will have to remain

living with their parents for the foreseeable future. Inflation has a stranglehold.

A severe shortage of doctors and nurses makes it difficult to see a doctor face to face, and those awaiting operations will wait a lot longer. Thousands of elderly people are being evicted from care homes. Many businesses have closed, yet fewer workers to harvest our fruit and vegetables indicate more food shortages ahead. Strikes galore in the NHS, along with teachers and railway workers, have only added greatly to the country's chaos.

At the time of writing, the City of Nottingham is in mourning and shock, following the murder of two young university students and a school caretaker. At the same time, an overcrowded boat from Libya, full of migrants, capsized, leaving hundreds missing, including many babies. The wars in Ukraine and Sudan rage on, and natural, climate disasters of drought, flooding, fire and volcanic eruption are causing huge devastation worldwide.

Yes, life is a struggle for millions, and there are no slick answers. Where is the Christian Church in all this? Most Churches continue to fill baskets for food banks in the UK, and many regularly open their premises weekly to supply food, warmth and friendship. Many wonderful Christian charities are involved non-stop in disaster areas around the world, thanks to constant giving by Christian supporters. Yes, Church happens within and beyond its walls.

I was inspired reading about the Church Army working in County Mayo in Ireland. The team there use KIntsugi pottery in their meetings, ministering to those in need. Kintsugi involves repairing broken pottery with gold paint, leaving a gold seam where the cracks are joined, and in the process giving the pottery a more refined look! **No broken person is beyond Christ's redemption!** That's the message. There is beauty in imperfection. The Good Samaritan always has a vital part to play, painting the gold on to others' human cracks.

Likewise, Jesus knew all about life's struggles. His own greatest struggle was in the Garden of Gethsemene, where he wrestled in prayer with God his Father, hoping to avoid the Cross. If the musical 'Les Miserables' had been written in his time, Jesus would have fervently sung "One day more, this never-ending road to Calvary". But in the end, Christ won the mighty victory over sin and death!

Let us thank God that even in these present times of struggle, there is still a growing desire for His salvation. I commend this great prayer, worth praying often. "O God, Who has folded back the mantle of the night, to clothe us in the golden glory of the day, chase from our hearts all gloomy thoughts, and so fill us with the brightness of hope, that we may effectively aspire to

to <u>unwon victories</u> THROUGH CHRIST our Lord. Amen." One day more! Press on.

Rejoice that Kevin Sinfield has joined the struggle to find a cure for MND, by running endless marathons for his Rugby friend Rob Burrow to raise needed cash. Rejoice too that the Bishop of Exeter has blessed a rowing boat, and its crew, who will attempt to row 550 miles in the Arctic Ocean to raise money for YMCA's ongoing battle with Exeter's homeless. Rejoice that Terry Waite has been knighted in the King's honours list after being kidnapped, and enduring 5 years in total darkness and isolation in Beirut. ALL these wonderful people are **making a difference** in the struggle, until the victory is won. Press on with your contribution! Press on with Christ!
