A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends

The great day has arrived! They have rebuilt the foundations, restored the walls and put the gates in place. All that is left now is to hold a rededication ceremony for the new city. This is more than just a question of cutting a ribbon and declaring the city 'open' however. This is also a declaration of faith in God as well as an act of thanksgiving. Any church which has undertaken a significant building project will be able to appreciate the sense of achievement, as well as relief and gratitude which accompanies its completion. Although they didn't perhaps have to contend with quite as much red tape as we do, that doesn't mean it wasn't a colossal undertaking, especially when you consider the amount of opposition they encountered along the way.

There is, however, something slightly odd about this rededication ceremony, namely that, normally, only the completion of a temple would be marked in this way. The temple was the holiest site in Jerusalem. It seems then, that this ceremony is making the point that everything within the walls is to be regarded as holy ground, or rather that, the inhabitants of the city are called to holiness, not just when they are worshipping, but in every part of their lives. They are called to holiness when out shopping. They are called to holiness when chatting with their neighbours. They are called to holiness when setting off for work. Holiness is a daunting concept. It means, not being 'holier than thou', but 'set apart for God'. As the covenant prayer says, we are not our own, but His. Holiness means remembering that we are His every single day, offering each day to His service, offering all our gifts and graces to be used for His glory. We are called to be God's distinctive people in every area of our lives, living in the world but not being of the world. This doesn't mean floating above everything that's happening around us, but rather a refusal to allow the world to dictate our thoughts and attitudes. It's all too easy to be carried away with the latest fashionable school of thought, but as Christians, we are called to subject everything to scrutiny, alongside seeking constantly to be led by God's spirit rather than the spirit of the age. It's a tall order, but it's what God requires of us, and if we truly give our lives over to Christ, we will begin to flourish, to be a blessing to the world even as we challenge it, and begin the journey towards becoming the people God calls us to be.

24th Dec


We will have Christmas games, songs and festive food

Reduce, Re-use and Recycle this Christmas

We all know the lyrics to a well-known Christmas song, 'It's the most wonderful time of the year' (I imagine that tune is now going through your mind!), so perhaps this year we can look at ways to make it more wonderful for our environment and maybe our bank balance.

Before Christmas:

Only buy what you need – a shocking amount of food is thrown away over Christmas & New Year. Try to be creative with recipes to use up your left-overs.

Sustainability - look for local produce at street markets or farm shops, locally made gifts at craft fayres and independent shops, as well as choosing items that are Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance etc.

Reduce waste – buy items with less packaging, get reusable items, choose a living tree in a pot and avoid disposable dinnerware.

Find alternatives to items that cannot be recycled – instead of glossy wrapping paper use wrapping paper that is made to be recyclable or plain brown paper which you can decorate with stampers or pen, cloth bags, a scarf or reusable gift bag. Instead of shiny Christmas crackers/hats you can make your own.

Turn the heating down a couple of degrees and put on a warm, cosy jumper and thick socks – this is something most of us are getting used to doing more as we are trying to save money on our heating bills.

Try to make something homemade like cards, gift tags, craft gifts, edible gifts or decorations. Or buy pre-loved items at one of the many charity shops or bring & buy sales.

Waste-free giving - instead of giving people 'stuff & things' which they often do not want or need, why not give them cherished memories & experiences like a day out, an afternoon tea, star gazing on the moors or whatever they might enjoy doing. Or you could make up your own personalised gift coupons eg. 'I will mow your lawn once a month, 'I will babysit for an evening', 'I'll visit & read to you every fortnight for a year' or 'I will walk your dog'.

After Christmas

Recycle all the rubbish you can in your green bin, a bottle bank or local council Recycling Centre, re-use by giving away unwanted items to Exeter Food Action (for food items), through Freecycle or to a local charity shop/bring & buy sale, or you can sell through eBay, Facebook Marketplace, Gumtree etc.

The beauty of Christmas is not in the presents but in His presence.
