A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

On the face of it, Nehemiah 3 isn't very exciting. It's about the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem, and basically it's a list of who did what. Big deal we might think. But what's going on is huge. In the last chapter, Nehemiah had gone back to Jerusalem to assess the damage, and survey the condition of the walls. He sees a pitiful scene of desolation before him. Instead of running away or giving in to despair, Nehemiah, conscious of his God-given calling, gathers the people together and puts before them a simple but point: rebuild these walls and they will protect Jerusalem against her enemies and restore her prestige in the world. They take up this challenge, with 43 different groups of people taking a section of the wall and working on it, rather like the construction of a medieval cathedral. This is a delightful chapter, because in it we see God's people coming together in a common endeavour. Their abilities were different, but they came together nonetheless and contributed whatever they were able in pursuit of the common goal.

It's true that their situation was desperate. In its ruined state, Jerusalem was vulnerable to attack from pretty much anybody. It was no good going back to their homeland, after so many years of exile, if they were just going to make sitting ducks of themselves. Being in such a situation can lend a clarity of thought lacking in more comfortable circumstances. The thing is, where the Israelites were in a physically desperate situation, we today are in a spiritually desperate one. Society drifts ever further from God. In the church, we have had decades of theology which has undermined our confidence in our faith, in our God, in the scriptures, and in our identity in Christ. The hollowed-out, wash out Christianity we are left with is not the supernatural, life-changing force brought to birth on the day of Pentecost. The walls we need to rebuild are spiritual ones. It can happen. Wonderful things do happen when God's people come together.

Green Team Article - Planting in Wonford

With houses being extended and parking spaces created, local gardens are getting smaller with less plants and trees. So it is great that two community groups have been busy planting locally.

Ludwell Life have planted up the Scrape (a shallow pond created in Butchers Field in Ludwell Valley) with nearly 800 plants including marsh marigolds, water mint, agrimony, yellow flag iris and speedwell. They are asking that dog walkers keep their dogs out of the pond while the plants establish themselves. In January they planted three new trees in their Community Orchard close to the Tollards Road entrance to Ludwell Valley Park.

Wonford Planters have been busy with the Pocket Park next to Wonford Green Surgery. The initial landscaping has been done and fruit trees are being planted this month. These include an apple tree dedicated to Mary Carpenter. Mary Carpenter was born In Exeter in 1807 and later moved with her family to Bristol. She was a social reformer who founded 'ragged schools' for children in slums and supported the higher education of women and the abolition of slavery. The Pocket Park will also have raised beds with herbs and everyone is welcome to sit in and/or tend.

How can WMC contribute to improving the local environment? When the car park is resurfaced we will probably lose the plants that have self-seeded at the base of walls but hopefully we can keep most of the roses and perhaps

add some evergreen plants alongside the fence. I would love to have scented plants that children could run their hands through as they walk on the wall and for people waiting at the new bus stop to enjoy. The Green Team have made a start on ridding the raised flower bed of ivy so we can have pollinator friendly plant in this and in a new flowerbed and planters. The fence has really improved the appearance of the Church and, though our space is small, with careful planting we can make it even more attractive as well as supporting wildlife!


Advance Notice
