# **A Message From The Minister**

#### Dear Friends,

Nehemiah 11 is not, I have to say, a gripping read. It's just a list of names. It may have been significant to those who knew these people but doesn't seem to say much to say to us today. In fact, I nearly didn't bother to write anything on it at all, skipping ahead to chapter 12. I had forgotten that all scripture is God-breathed, and every single syllable is important, even the bits that sometimes leave us baffled. Take Nehemiah 11 as an example. The phrase, 'the Holy City' is used only 5 times in the whole of scripture and two of those are in this chapter. This must be significant. This Holy City, Jerusalem lies in ruins. Once a beacon to the world, the sight of the great Temple, containing the holiest of holies, symbolising the very presence of God. After the exile of the Israelites, this city became desolate, empty and bleak. Now that the rebuilding and restoration of Jerusalem has begun, the city obviously needs a decent population to make it come alive again. The trouble was, nobody wanted to go. The Israelites had made new lives for themselves, farming the land they had found themselves in, and making more money for themselves than if they returned to city life. Some volunteered to go back, but the rest had to be chosen by lot. It's astounding, really. God's Holy City needs people, fallible mortals such as you and I, or it is nothing. God chooses to make Himself known in the world through His people.

This is no less true today. We are the Church, the body of Christ on earth. When people talk about 'the Church', they usually mean either a building or an institution. We hear people talking endlessly about how the church needs to be 'reshaped for mission', restructured, reorganised, more diktats, more bureaucracy, more statements about current affairs, in order to be relevant. As if the Church has declined in this country because it isn't organised properly. What rubbish. If the church is declining, it's because people have turned away from, or have never encountered, the gospel - new life in Christ. We don't need more programmes and initiatives, we need to see conversions, new people coming to follow Jesus Christ, more people beginning the joyous journey to eternal life, having realised that Christ makes this possible for them. God can use even flawed church systems and structures, but it's a different story if new people are not coming to faith, whilst those who are Christians slowly die off. I'm talking about revival. Every so often, the body of Christ needs re-energising, revitalising, new life poured into it. This is just such a time. After a long period of desolation, Jerusalem was built up, reinhabited, made alive again. The same can happen to today's church - if we pray for it, expect it and plan for it. God is in the business of rebuilding ancient ruins, and there is always hope.

than always buying new and you may be able to get yourself an early Christmas present.


26th November – for National Tree week we will have a tree quiz and for those who want to you can have a go at creating some leaf art.

#### 19th November – World Toilet Day

People often smile or even chuckle at the mention of toilets but this day reminds us that for so many around the world it is certainly no laughing matter. World Toilet Day celebrates toilets, raises awareness of the 3.6 billion people living without access to safely managed sanitation and that every day, more than 800 children die from diarrhoea linked to unsafe water, sanitation and poor hygiene.

The United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 6 is water and sanitation for all by 2030. This year the theme is 'Sanitation and Groundwater' and it focuses on the impact of the sanitation crisis on groundwater. Inadequate

sanitation systems spread human waste into rivers, lakes and soil, polluting the water resources under our feet. However, this problem seems to be invisible because it happens underground and in the poorest and most marginalised communities. Groundwater is our most abundant source of freshwater. It supports our drinking water supplies, sanitation systems, farming, industry and ecosystems. As climate change worsens and populations grow, groundwater is vital for our survival. Safely managed sanitation protects groundwater from human waste pollution. This means everyone having access to a toilet connected to a sanitation system.

Give thanks to the Lord that we each have access to our own toilet, sanitation and clean running water. Pray for those who don't and that charities like WaterAid, water.org and Sanitation & Water for All will work with local partners to try to ensure every person can access to a sanitary toilet.

#### 27th November – the start of National Tree week

National Tree Week is the UK's biggest annual tree celebration. It was originally called Plant A Tree in '73, and started in (you guessed it!) 1973 in response to Dutch Elm Disease - a tree disease that stops them from getting water properly. It's all about getting lots of communities to do more to help their local environment by planting as many trees as they can. It starts in November because this is when the tree planting season starts, it's best for them to be planted as it's starting to get cold. Even though the event only lasts for one week, tree planting season lasts right up until March.

So why are trees important? Trees are a vital part of our ecosystem.

- They take in carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and put out oxygen.
- They help keep our air clean, which is vital to keep climate change under control.
- Nutrients in the soil come from trees, which helps lots of other plants grow.
- Hundreds of kinds of wildlife, like birds, bugs, and squirrels as well as other kinds of plants all live in or on trees. Without them, countless animals would lose their homes or sources of food.
- Plus, trees help protect us from extreme weather. Their long roots and canopy of leaves help prevent flooding and stop soil eroding. Big leaves provide lots of shade when it's very hot and provide shelter when it's very cold, so local temperatures are less extreme.

Oh, and we mustn't forget, — they look beautiful, we often enjoy the sound of them moving in the breeze and kicking our way through the golden fallen leaves in autumn.

Please give thanks to God for trees, take a local walk amongst the many beautiful trees in Ludwell Valley Park and in the former Northbrook golf course or even plant a tree to remember a loved one. And remember, you are never too old to kick up a pile of crisp fallen autumn leaves or hold a colourful leaf in your hand as you marvel at its beauty or even to hug a tree!

### **Blythswood Care Shoebox Appeal 2022**

Last November, in our Church Hall, the Exeter Blythswood group processed and sent 1216 shoeboxes from Exeter & East Devon to people living in abject poverty in Ukraine. It was wonderful to think that our boxes brought a little bit of happiness to each of the



people opening them in December and discovering the gifts inside! Then in February, that became even more poignant when we heard of the invasion and subsequent horrors of war that the people of Ukraine have to endure. Whilst praying for the Ukrainian people we have been imagining some of them wearing a hand kitted scarf or clutching a small teddy bear that may have come from one of our gift-filled boxes as they flee their homes or went in to hiding. We continue to pray for the people of Ukraine – for safety & shelter, reconciliation & restoration and for peace across their land. We are collecting boxes through Blythswood Care again this year.

Blythswood Care is an established Christian charity based in Glasgow, Scotland. They bring hope to families in Europe, Africa and Asia through filled shoeboxes at Christmas, relief and development aid or social projects for young and old. Their motto is 'transforming lives through Christian care for body and soul'.

You need to cover a shoebox in wrapping paper with the lid wrapped separately so it can be opened easily and they can be for adults as well as teenagers and children. The categories are Male or Female; Preschool, Primary, Teenager, Adult or Elderly.

Their website <u>www.blythswood.org</u> will provide a full checklist of items that can be put in the shoeboxes and you can print of a label from there, but if you don't have access to a printer then I can give you a leaflet. The donation towards cost of transporting each shoebox is £3. **Date for final collection at Wonford Methodist is Sunday 13th November.** 

Most important items - toothbrush & toothpaste, soap & flannel, hat/scarf/gloves, sweets (dated at least March 2023), a small toy and pencils/pens/paper. Other suggested items for children - a ball, skipping rope, hair accessories, puzzles, stickers. For adults - shampoo, deodorant, comb, sewing equipment, candles (but no matches), kitchen utensils, screwdriver/pliers, pack of cards, small wind up torch and for teenage girls/woman-sanitary products.

To any of our talented knitters, each year we are most in need of scarves, large hats and mittens or fingerless gloves please, for both children and adults. You might like to add in a Christmas card with a message, your name & town/country but do not put in your address. If you have any questions or you want to donate a few items or money instead of filling a box then please let me know - all contributions are very welcome and will help to put a smile on the faces of people who live in such poverty.

Please do contribute if you can. This shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given and what a Christmas present for someone truly in need!
