A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

Psalm 27

Life is complex and seems to be getting more so. And when life is complex, it becomes more important than ever to remember simple truths. This is because, behind all the fluctuations of world events, there are certain things which remain true, regardless of the world's tumult. The psalmist seems to be in a situation of conflict and is under attack. With that in mind, what does he pray for? Triumph over his enemies? That's what you might expect, but no, he prays for only one thing – that he may 'dwell in the house of the Lord' all the days of his life and to 'gaze on His beauty' and 'seek Him in His temple'. This reminds me of Martha and Mary, the latter being commended by Jesus for sitting at His feet in an attitude of devotion, listening and learning from her Lord. The one thing needful, as Jesus says.

This might seem simplistic and inadequate when times are tough. In fact, it's essential. Worship, devotion and having an open heart towards God are not luxuries for the super spiritual. They are our first calling, the key to our life's purpose and our highest privilege- as well as our bread and butter as Christians. What's more, they fortify us in readiness for the bad times. When we live a life of worship, we know we are never truly alone and grace and strength come to us when we most need it. This has been the testimony of millions. Wait for the Lord. Blythswood Care Shoebox Appeal 2023

Last November, in our Church Hall, the Exeter Blythswood group processed and sent 1626 shoeboxes from Exeter & East Devon to people living in abject poverty in Ukraine. It is a blessing to think that our boxes brought a little bit of happiness to each of the people opening them in December and



discovering the gifts inside! We continue to pray for the people of Ukraine – for safety & shelter, reconciliation & restoration and for peace across their land.

We are collecting boxes through Blythswood Care again this year. Blythswood Care is an established Christian charity based in Glasgow, Scotland. They bring hope to families in Europe, Africa and Asia through filled shoeboxes at Christmas, relief and development aid or social projects for young and old. Their motto is 'transforming lives through Christian care for body and soul'.



You need to cover a shoebox in wrapping paper with the lid wrapped separately so it can be opened easily and they can be for adults as well as teenagers and children. The categories are Male or Female; Preschool, Primary, Teenager, Adult or Elderly.

Their website <u>www.blythswood.org</u> will provide a full checklist of items that can be put in the shoeboxes and you can print of a label from there, but if you don't have access to a printer then I can give you a leaflet. The donation towards cost of transporting each shoebox is £3. Date for final collection at Wonford Methodist is Sunday 19th November.

Most important items - toothbrush & toothpaste, soap & flannel, hat/ scarf/gloves, sweets (dated at least March 2024), a small toy and pencils/pens/ paper. Other suggested items for children - a ball, skipping rope, hair accessories, puzzles, stickers. For adults shampoo, deodorant, comb, sewing equipment, candles (but no



matches), kitchen utensils, screwdriver/pliers, pack of cards, small wind up torch and for teenage girls/woman- sanitary products.

To any of our talented knitters, each year we are most in need of scarves, large hats (we have too many small ones) and mittens or fingerless gloves please, for both children and adults. You might like to add in a Christmas card with a message, your name & town/country but do not put in your address. If you have any questions or you want to donate a few items or money instead of filling a box then please let me know - all contributions are very welcome and will help to put a smile on the faces of people who live in such poverty.

Please do contribute if you can. This shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given and what a Christmas present for someone truly in need!

A lovely story about Jesus, which was not included in the Gospels, features a dead dog lying in the street. A crowd of angry residents had gathered round this dead animal. "What a filthy animal fouling up our street!" "It's such an ugly creature!" "This appalling stench makes me sick!" Just three of the comments by these bystanders.

Then Jesus appears on the scene, and kneels down to examine the dead dog. He speaks to the resentful onlookers: "You know, I've never seen such beautiful teeth! They're as beautiful as pearls." The powerful message from this story is: Accentuate The Positive!

Zacchaeus was a hated tax collector in Jericho. When Jesus visited the packed town, Zacchaeus shinned up that sycamore tree not only because he was a small man and wanted a better view, but also because he was a hated outcast in his own town. But Jesus nonplussed the clamouring crowd by stopping at that sycamore tree, and asking the town's unlikeliest person, Zacchaeus, if he could have a cup of tea in his house! Through that encounter, the ostracised tax collector became a completely new person, and offered to give half of his possessions to the poor. A. T. P.

Even in bereavement and the loss of someone precious, there is always the positive hope of reunion with the Living Christ. For over two years, I took my wife Sheila every week for chemotherapy at the hospital, and we regularly encouraged each other by saying 'A T P' to one another, as we went in the ward. Even when she couldn't speak, she regularly squeezed my hand; it was her way of declaring her love, and that nothing could take away her faith in her Saviour.

Over the years I have been privileged to take Church groups to Israel, where we pilgrims walked where Jesus walked. For me, the outstanding highlight every time was in the Garden of Resurrection in Jerusalem. Having taken our party into the empty tomb, I then watched hundreds of other Christians from all over the world coming out of that same tomb uplifted, strengthened and inspired. Whatever language they spoke, they were all echoing the same words: "He Is Risen!" One group of Japanese Christians emerged fervently singing, "Because He Lives." A. T. P.

Or as St Paul would have echoed from his rat-infested prison cell: "For I am convinced that neither death nor life.....nor anything else in all creation has any power to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord!"


