A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends

Advent calendars aren't just for children anymore. You could, if you're so inclined, buy a calendar with tea, cheese, even gin behind each December door. When I was little, opening that days door was a cherished before school ritual (though if you opt for the gin calendar, I recommend you wait until rather later in the day before sampling each day's delights..). As an adult however, I've spotted a slight flaw in the very concept of Advent calendars – namely that they give the impression that Advent is simply the 'run-up to Christmas', when it is of course a season in its own right. It is connected to Christmas, obviously, and it is the season in which we do our Christmas shopping, eat mince pies, go to Carol services and put up with being bombarded by Christmas music in shops. Yet Advent encourages a richer, deeper experience beyond all the anxious Christmas preparations which fill our minds at this time of year.

Advent draws our minds to various people who were used by God to announce His purposes to the world, and to prepare the world for the coming of the Messiah. In doing so, they call us to remember that there is more to life than just what we see in front of us. The power and presence of God constantly break through into our world even though, most of the time, we live as they though didn't. Advent is a good time to spend some time with the prophets, with John the Baptist, and with Mary, and pray that we might be gifted their kind of faith, the faith that, through prayer, seeks the presence of God, and draws the work of God into our lives and our churches. We, after all, are as much a part of the story of God and His people as the great Advent figures - so let's refresh our faith, pray for the renewal and revival of the church, be willing to be part of what God is doing so that we can go forward into 2025 as confident, spirit-filled people of faith, whatever the future might bring. Because we know, that ultimately, the future is in God's hands. Happy Advent!


Christmas Morning of carols, stories, poems, etc

14th December - it's time once again for our Christmas party, so please come along to join us for fun games and party food.


21st December - we will be singing Christmas carols and having the dress rehearsal of our skit for the church Carol Service.

Reduce, Re-use and Recycle this Christmas

We all know the lyrics to a well-known Christmas song, 'It's the most wonderful time of the year' (I imagine that tune is now going through your mind!), so perhaps we



can look at ways to make it more wonderful for our environment and maybe our bank balance.

Before Christmas

- Only buy what you need a shocking amount of food is thrown away over Christmas & New Year. Try to be creative with recipes to use up your leftovers.
- Sustainability look for local produce at street markets or farm shops, locally made gifts at craft fayres and independent shops, as well as choosing items that are Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance etc.
- Reduce waste buy items with less packaging, get reusable items, choose a living tree in a pot and avoid disposable dinnerware.
- Find alternatives to items that cannot be recycled instead of glossy wrapping paper use wrapping paper that is made to be recyclable or plain brown paper which you can decorate with stampers or pen, cloth bags, a scarf or reusable gift bag. Instead of shiny Christmas crackers/hats you can make your own.
- Turn the heating down a couple of degrees and put on a warm, cosy jumper and thick socks this is something most of us are getting used to doing more as we are trying to save money on our heating bills.
- Have a go at making something homemade like cards, gift tags, craft gifts, edible gifts or decorations. Or buy pre-loved items at one of the many charity shops or bring & buy sales.
- Waste-free giving instead of giving people 'stuff & things' which they often do not want or need, why not give them cherished memories & experiences like a day out, an afternoon tea, star gazing on the moors or whatever they might enjoy doing. Or you could make up your own personalised gift coupons eg. 'I will mow your lawn once a month, 'I will babysit for an evening', 'I'll visit & read to you every fortnight for a year' or 'I will walk your dog'

After Christmas

Recycle all the rubbish you can in your green bin, a bottle bank or local council Recycling Centre, re-use by giving away unwanted items to Exeter Food Action (for food items), through Freecycle or to a local charity shop/ bring & buy sale, or you can sell through eBay. Facebook Marketplace,

Gumtree, etc

The Greatest Story Every Told

Several years ago, I led a party of 30 Church members to Cyprus, 'In The Steps Of St Paul'. One day, we visited the magnificent Roman amphitheatre at Kourion. Two coach loads of local Cypriot children were seated in a block, and their teacher began to explain the fascinating history of this place, which was their heritage.

But after five minutes in this glorious setting, she had to give up. The children simply weren't listening! These hundred bored children made their way back to their very smart coaches to return to their school. I managed to speak to the dejected teacher before she left. "It is very hard. They live for themselves; they don't want to learn."

A recent study in the UK has revealed that over 40% of our people are now atheists! More than those declaring themselves Christian! Many will send 'Festive Greetings' cards this year, rather than 'Christmas Joy To You'. There's no denying our Churches have lost vast numbers of young people in recent years. Many now have no Junior Church at all.

I remember watching an old James Bond film with my grandchildren twenty years ago. All Bond stories are similarly frightening: some arch-enemy wants to possess a mega-nuclear warhead, or have global control over others. (eg, Elliott Carver, Hugo Drax, Maximilian Largo etc) Our unchanging challenge is to remind ourselves that the most sensational story of all time is still the story of Jesus! And His Church exists to share that news enthusiastically with others. In the film 'The Greatest Story Ever Told', (which received 5 Academy Award nominations) one highlight shows three men hurrying towards Jerusalem's guarded wall. One shouts up, "I've just seen a dead man brought back to life!" Then a young man hollers, "I was a cripple, but now I can walk and run!" Finally, an old man arrives and shouts, "I was blind, but now I can see!" The Roman officer yells down, "Who has done these things?" All three yell back, "Jesus of Nazareth!"

This story is not boring. It is life-giving! Christmas is meant to be **CHRISTmas!** Christ at the centre of Christmas. A Saviour has been born to us! And His emphasis? "I have come that you may have life!" ANYONE who has genuine contact with Jesus, has this life. Peace in our war-torn world is possible through this Jesus, and our vital role is to keep sharing this greatest story ever told.

"Tell me the old, old story, Christ Jesus makes you whole." "......fling wide the gates, and welcome Him into your lives." A BLESSED CHRISTMAS TO YOU!
