## A Message From The Minister

## Dear Friends,

## Psalm 73

Most of us have an inbuilt sense of justice. We feel anger when we see people profiting at the expense of others. In an age when many demand that their governments intervene to ensure equality (which never seems to work out well, however good the intentions), we might wonder why God doesn't do the same. Surely, God can step in to see that nobody goes without, and that those who exploit others don't enjoy their ill-gotten gains for very long? The writer of Psalm 73 wrestles with this very issue. Oppression and iniquity abound, and the perpetrators get away with it.

Yet the Psalm ends in the most remarkable and beautiful way. Even when the Psalmist feel aggrieved and embittered, when he stands back and looks at the big picture, he realises that God is always with him and, more than that, will lead him to glory. In other words, the answer is not to shake our fists at the sky and scream about the unfairness of it all, but to look deeper, to see the connections between earth and heaven. Only then can we even begin to understand, in however inadequate a fashion, some of the meaning behind it all. By that I don't mean that 'everything happens for a reason'. I mean that a loving God is ultimately in control, a God who dwells in glory, a glory which is our destination too. Where does this leave us though in the here and now? It leaves us with the task of cultivating trust in this God, the God made known to us in Jesus Christ, allowing Him to transform us, and pointing others towards Him too. God brings change through transforming human hearts. Governments will always let us down and we shouldn't have too high hopes of what the state can do. It will always remain true however, that though 'our heart and our flesh may fail, God is the strength of our lives and our portion forever'. Amen.

## The Northbrook

The Northbrook is Wonford Methodist Church's local stream - it flows along the bottom of nearby Ludwell Valley. There is also a tributary which currently runs down Wonford Street and next to the Church in a culvert but which probably used to fill the moat of the medieval Great House on the site of the Birch Court flats (previously Gardeners Arms).
Locally the Northbrook is known as the Panny possibly named by the cavalry from the nearby Barracks who exercised their horses in the area when it was just fields.
The Northbrook stream has two main tributaries, one that starts up in Beacon Heath and goes through Whipton and another that starts in Stoke Hill and goes through Hamlin Lane Playing fields (JLC), and these meet in Vaughan Road. The stream flows underground at Heavitree Bridge and then through Wonford Playing Fields and Northbrook Park into the River Exe. So there are probably quite a few Church folk living close to the Panny! A small group of us, including members of Heavitree Local History Society and the Mile Lane Pod, are hoping to produce a leaflet about the Panny and would love hear people's recollections of playing near or in it.
Gary remembers that the Hele's School cross country route went through the Panny which annoyed his Mum - from a laundry point of view!
At Wonford Welcome on June 22nd we will be having a local history morning with photos and information about old Wonford and we would love people to come along to share their knowledge and memories particularly of the Panny. Please invite any neighbours, family or friends who might be interested. Thank you.

## Bible Month 2024 - Genesis

Bible Month takes place during June each year and in 2024 the Methodist Church is feasting on the Book of Genesis.
Through a menu of carefully curated resources, training and learning opportunities, churches and circuits are encouraged to taste and see the goodness of an individual text; enjoying some of its unique flavours, considering its origins, appreciating its place alongside the rest of Scripture, and savouring the unique contribution it might make to our faithful living and learning today.
Genesis is the starting point for all Christian theology and explores many of the foundational questions of life and faith:
Who is God? What is God like? How does God interact with the world? How is that world meant to be? What does it mean to be human? What does it look like to be God's people?
Through the book, we get to journey with many different characters as they wrestle (sometimes literally!) with finding answers to these questions in the midst of the messiness and uncertainty of life.

## A Short Introduction to Genesis

The stories of Genesis divide neatly into 4 bit-sized chunks, which we'll take each at a time over 4 weeks starting on Sunday 9th June 2024:

> Week 1: The Sovereign God who Creates (Chapters 1-11)
> Week 2: The God who Calls and Blesses (Chapters 12-25)
> Week 3: The God who Comes to People in their Struggles (Chapters 25-36) Week 4: The God who Confirms and Safeguards Divine Promises (Chapters 37-50)

"Nation With Nation......Shall Live As Comrades Free"
In the ever-watchable film "Sister Act", Sister Mary Patrick firmly states "l'm a sucker for a happy ending". Thanks to Sister Mary Clarence's singing skills, their Academy choir in San Francisco wins a major competition, which prevents their Academy being closed down. A very happy ending.
Right now in the real world, it's hard to see how 'happy ending' could apply to the devastating, inhuman situation in Gaza and Ukraine. The killing of those 7 aid workers, who were trying to bring vital relief to millions on the verge of starvation, only pushed a possible, peaceful ending further into the distance. As for the hymn 'Nation with nation...... shall live as comrades free', that hope seems light years away! One Gaza doctor commented, "Everywhere you see people shocked and terrified, just staring out expressionless."
In 2011, an earthquake in Fukushima caused a nuclear power plant to release vast amounts of radiation, which seeped into the land around, and on to its crops. The people responded by planting a quarter of a million sunflower seeds. Sunflowers now bloom everywhere in Fukushima! They absorb all that radiation. A happy ending from a world-threatening situation. And that's what Jesus did on the Cross! By His death, He absorbed all human sin and violence, and brought new hope into our suffering world by His Resurrection! This Risen Christ really is the Saviour! "The vilest offender who truly believes, that moment from Jesus a pardon receives." His love can absorb evil; violence has no chance. He conquered sin and death once and for all! The happiest of endings.
Recently, I spoke with a distinguished, retired leader in the Methodist Church. He was apprehensive about falling numbers, fewer ministers and preachers, and not least the considerable number of churches that have recently closed down. He wondered what the future held for us. I reminded him that the Church in this country in the 18th century was sluggish and ineffective until 24th May 1738 at 8.45 pm, when John Wesley's heart was 'strangely warmed'! Thereafter thousands of men and women were won into the Christian faith! With prayer and expectancy we can have a repeat outpouring of God's Holy Spirit! We can even expect 'nation with nation' living in peace!
Jesus Himself powerfully reminds us that when we plant a seed in the ground, it dies, but in so doing it produces a wonderful harvest. Like Sister Mary Patrick, I remain a sucker for happy endings. Do you?
