# **A** Message From The Minister

### Dear Friends,

'He has given us everything we need for life and godliness' says Peter in the second of his New Testament letters, which is a wonderful thing but oddly, very easy to forget. We are now in the period between Easter Day and Pentecost, so now is a good time to remind ourselves of all the wonderful things which these two events make possible for us. Jesus rose from the dead, having attacked at its root the stranglehold of sin and death over our lives and the, as if that were not enough, sent to His people the gift of the Spirit, God's presence within us, to enable us to become the people God wants us to be. There is nothing more God could have given us than His very self and, whatever life might throw at us, there is much to be thankful for.

Our society has been so spiritually barren for so long that people are increasingly looking for real meaning and hope in our angry, divided and materialistic culture. Our politics have failed. Various political ideologies have failed to transform society for the better. In particular, attempts to enforce 'inclusion' in misguided ways have only made us more divided than ever (ironically!). However, many churches which honour the scriptures and believe the gospel (not a watered down version of it) are seeing growth. I am certain that God is doing something in this country and many others and it is essential that we feed our prayers into this crucial moment. The resurrection and Pentecost have reverberated for the past 2,000 years, as empires have come and gone, as political movements have grown and retreated, as wars and rumours of wars haunted the life of nations. God's kingdom, unlike earthly kingdoms is permanent, solid and eternal and it's there that we should pin our hearts. When anyone puts their faith in Christ, they become a citizen of the kingdom of God and become heirs to an inheritance that can 'never perish, spoil or fade' (Peter again). We are forgiven and adopted as God's children because of the resurrection. God's spirit dwells within us because of Pentecost. He has indeed given us everything we need for the fullest life possible on earth and the certain hope and a wonderful future beyond our mortal existence. We are heirs to the most magnificent inheritance imaginable - so let's pray that everyone knows it!

### **Be Still**

When my children were teenagers and on school holiday, a variety of loud music regularly burst in on my study. Not the best background noise when I was trying to work or pray! Fortunately, I was friends with a Jesuit who ran the Retreat House in the famous Loyola Hall near where I lived. He generously offered me room 41 anytime I needed it.

Room 41 had a chair and a table, nothing else except silence! It was a haven for work and prayer, far from the madding crowd. If you have watched the powerful film 'The Shawshank Redemption', you will recall that prisoner Brooks had the opposite experience. In 1934, he was released on parole from his notorious Maine jail after serving fifty years! Not surprisingly, old Brooks found it a nightmare adjusting to the speed of traffic: "The world went and got itself into a big, damned hurry!"

Goodness knows how Brooks would have coped 90 years later, with vastly more traffic and a wholly computerised society, where everyone is urged to get 'full fibre broadband' to speed up one's life even more! Perhaps in desperation, Brooks would have booked one of those 'modern' 21st century holidays, where on arrival at the hotel everyone must hand in his mobile phone! No computers allowed.

The Church Army nowadays are tackling some very demanding, but vital work, with young people in deprived areas. One Evangelist, Steve, states his keenness to put into practice 'double listening'. First, listening to teenagers who are struggling with drug addiction, food poverty and low income etc, fully understanding their situation, before explaining what an evangelist does. "We want to serve them in ways they think are useful and needed, not just what we think they need." And then, secondly listening to God! How best will God direct him and his team in leading those young people into faith?

There is no substitute for prayer! Every Christian needs to make time for prayer. Jesus Himself gave clear instructions in Matthew 6 v 6. He urges, "Don't go on babbling...." Listen to God! No doubt one of Jesus' favourite

texts would have been Psalm 46 v10: "Be still, and know that I am God!" The best preparation for Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

"Be still, for the power of the Lord is moving in this place: He comes to cleanse and heal, to minister His grace – No work too hard for Him, in faith receive from Him. Be still, for the power of the Lord is moving in this place."

# A Prayer Following the Death of Pope Francis

Almighty God,

We thank you that you continue to call disciples to represent you on earth.

We recognise this call in the life, faith and ministry of Pope Francis.

We give thanks for the unique gifts with which you blessed him for this task, and for his obedience in fulfilling all that you asked of him.

Thank you for receiving Francis into the eternal home that you have been preparing for him.

We pray that all who mourn his loss will be comforted and for the Conclave that will elect his successor.

We hold before you the Roman Catholic Church and pray that we might continue to work together for the unity of your Church and for peace, justice and compassion in your world.

We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ.

The Revd Ruth Gee, former President of the Methodist Conference and current Co-Chair of the British Methodist-Roman Catholic Dialogue Commission, shares the following reflection:

When Jorge Mario Bergoglio was elected Pope on 13 March 2013 he chose Francis as his Papal name. This was a clear indication of the emphases on service of people living in poverty, humility, and concern for creation, that would characterise his papacy.

There was a further indication of these emphases on his first appearance as Pope on the balcony of St Peter's Basilica. He wore a simple white cassock and the iron pectoral cross he had worn as archbishop.

In the years following his election Pope Francis wrote and spoke about the Christian vocation to serve. He challenged world leaders when they did not recognise the obligation to serve others, to welcome and protect refugees, and to protect the environment.

These among many characteristics of his papacy endeared Pope Francis to people around the world including those of other Christian churches and other faiths. His commitment to ecumenism and to inter-religious dialogue has been evident, not least in the good relationship with the Methodist Ecumenical Office in Rome (MEOR). Pope Francis has often been pictured talking and laughing with the Revd Matthew Laferty, Director of MEOR, representing the world-wide Methodist Church on official occasions in the Vatican.

There are many reasons to thank God for the ministry of Pope Francis, not

because he has been perfect, but because he has seen himself as a servant of God and a servant of those with whom he has sought to share God's love.


The humility which was evident in his inauguration will also be evident in his funeral which has been simplified at his request. Pope Francis will be buried in a simple wooden casket in a location outside the Vatican.

May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

The Revd Matthew Laferty, Director of the Methodist Ecumenical Office in Rome, said:

Pope Francis was a man of deep Christian faith, clear conviction, and prayer. His ministry extended beyond the Catholic Church as he sought to pray and work for the unity of all Christians. Pope Francis challenged and inspired Methodists and Catholics to move beyond ecumenical dialogue to be a pilgrim people walking and working together, particularly in care of creation, migration, and human fraternity. He called the Church universal and all the world to live as Jesus Christ—in holiness and in loving the poor and the marginalised.
